

Graduate Fall Application, Admission, and Enrollment History, Fall 2002 to Fall 2006







Table 10: New Undergraduate Admissions English and Math Placement Test Results Fall 2006


English Placement Results

Percentage of New Undergraduates who Tested into Freshman Math or Higher, 2002 to 2006




